

## Health Beat: Seasonal Affect Disorder (SAD)

Self-care during the winter months can be difficult because of cooler temperatures and the decrease in daylight hours. When individuals are not exposed to sunlight their levels of vitamin D are decreased, affecting their overall mental well-being. It is recommended by mental health professionals to manage energy on three levels: physical, mental, and social. Some common tips include establishing and maintaining routines, making a point to get out of the house to get exposure to sunlight and fresh air, sticking to healthy eating patterns including omega-3s and vitamins, getting enough sleep, and reaching out to your social support networks regularly. Some changes in your mood are to be expected with the extreme cold and snow but some individuals may experience more significant symptoms that could be Seasonal Affect Disorder (SAD). SAD is a type of depression that often occurs during the fall and winter. Some symptoms of SAD include feeling a lack of energy or motivation daily, losing interest in previously enjoyed activities, excessive sleeping, and difficulty concentrating. It is important to be aware of any of these changes that become more severe and seek out additional support as needed.




